Cathedral Island

The oldest part of Wrocław, offers a chance to experience the city in its unchanged form preserved for centuries.

Gothic buildings rise above the skyline, allowing to feel the city's rich past.



The Market Square

The heart of Wrocław, offering everything from business and shopping to sightseeing and fine dining.

During the day, the square buzzes with tourists and office workers.

At night it transforms into the city's most vibrant entertainment area.



The Centennial Hall

In UNESCO World Heritage List.

At the time of construction it was
the largest reinforced concrete
structure in the world.

Today, it serves as a space for
meetings, recreation, and
entertainment.



Hydropolis

Unique in Europe.

Its storytelling about water is rich and diverse, ensuring that there's never a dull moment.

It occupies a former clean-water reservoir built in 1893.

Multimedia technologies, interactive installations, realistic models, and touch screens.



ZOO and Afrykarium

The zoo's greatest attraction is the Afrykarium — a one-of-a-kind oceanarium on a global scale.

District of Four Temples

Sakwowy Bastion and Partisans' Hill

One of the best-preserved
bastions in Wrocław.

Was built 1555-1557 as part of a

artillery.

There is a beautiful view of the
surrounding area, including the
City Moat and nearby parks.



The Racławice Panorama Museum

One of only few in the world.

A monumental 360° painting.

Combination of artistic techniques, lighting effects, sculpted terrain, and a darkened entrance pathway, the installation creates a illusion of participating in a historic event.




National Forum of Music (NFM)

and classical performances.



The Botanical Garden

Often called an oasis of beauty and tranquility in the heart of a bustling city, serves both as a scientific center and a favorite leisure spot for residents. The second oldest garden in Poland, listed as a historic monument of Lower Silesia.

The Japanese Garden

One of most popular walking spots. In addition to hundreds of species of unique plants, trees, shrubs, and flowers, it features traditional Japanese-style structures. One of its main attractions is a pond filled with large koi carp and other fish species. The garden often hosts tea ceremonies, concerts, and outdoor events.


The Oder River
